### EXPORTATION OF ARMS AND WARLIKE STORES

**1.** This Act may be cited as the Exportation of Arms and Warlike Stores Act. **Short title.**

**2.** The Cabinet may by proclamation or by order prohibit or restrict in any way they may specify in such proclamation or order the exportation from Antigua and Barbuda either generally or to any country or place or the carrying coastwise of the following goods, that is to say, arms, ammunition and gunpowder and military and naval stores and any articles which the Cabinet shall judge capable of being converted into or made useful in increasing the quantity of military or naval stores, provisions or any sort of victual which may be used as food for man. **Prohibition of exportation generally of warlike stores.**

**3.** The Cabinet may by like proclamation or order prohibit the exportation from Antigua and Barbuda of all or any of the following articles namely arms, ammunition, military and naval stores and any article which the Cabinet shall judge capable of being converted into or made useful in increasing the quantity of arms, ammunition or military or naval stores to any country or place therein named whenever the Cabinet shall judge such prohibition to be expedient in order to prevent such arms, ammunition, military or naval stores being used against Her Majesty's subjects or forces or against any forces engaged or which may be engaged in military or naval operations in co-operation with Her Majesty's forces.

Penalty.

**4.** If any goods, the exportation or carrying coastwise whereof, as the case may be, shall have been prohibited under the authority of this Act, shall be exported or brought to any quay wharf pier or other place to be shipped for exportation from Antigua and Barbuda or carried coastwise, as the case may be, or be waterborne to be so exported or carried they shall be forfeited and the exporter or his agent or the shipper of any such goods shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding five thousand dollars and such penalty may be recovered on complaint in a summary manner before a Magistrate in accordance with the provisions of the Magistrate's Code of Procedure Act.
