- 1. This Act may be cited as the HUGH BURROWES Short title. (Pension) Act.
- **2.** (1) Notwithstanding anything contained in any law Power to grant relating to the granting of pensions or to the basis to be taken for the purpose of computing the amount of an officer's pension, there may be granted to HUGH BURROWES, a basis of Magistrate, in respect of his service as Magistrate a grat-computation uity and pension under the Pensions Act and it is hereby declared that for the purpose of computing the amount of any gratuity, pension or allowance payable hereunder, HUGH BURROWES shall be deemed at the time of his retirement to have been the holder of the office of Magistrate from the commencement of his employment as Magistrate for a period of ten years and to have been in receipt of the full pensionable emoluments in respect of that office.
- (2) Subject hereto the provisions of the Pensions Act shall apply to a pension granted hereunder.
