THE LABOUR COMMISSIONER (AMENDMENT) ACT, 2017

No. 3 of 2017

AN ACT to amend the Labour Commissioner Act, Cap. 232 and for incidental and connected purposes.

ENACTED by the Parliament of Antigua and Barbuda as follows-

1. Short title and commencement

This Act may be cited as the Labour Commissioner (Amendment) Act, 2017.

2. Interpretation

In this Act, “the principal Act” means the Labour Commissioner Act, Cap. 232.

3. Amendment of the principal Act

The principal Act is amended by repealing the words “workman” and “workmen” wherever they appear in the Act and substituting therefor the words “employee” and “employees” respectively.

4. Amendment of section 6 (1)(a) of principal Act

The principal Act is amended by repealing paragraph 6 (1)(a) and substituting therefor the following —

“to visit and inspect any premises in which employees are employed between the hours of 6 a.m. and 6 p.m., and to obtain and to require from any employer information as to the number of such employees employed and the wages, hours and conditions of work of such employees.”

5. Amendment of section 11 of the principal Act

The principal Act is amended in section 11 by inserting after the words, “Police Force” the following—

“The Office of National Drug and Money Laundering Control Policy”.
