shall seem meet, to dispense with the concurrence of the husband in any case in which his concurrence is required by law; and all acts and deeds to be done, executed, or made by his wife in pursuance of such order in regard to lands, or in regard to money subject to be invested in the purchase of lands, shall be done, executed, or made by her in the same manner as if she were *feme sole*, and when done, executed, or made by her shall (but without prejudice to the rights of the husband as then existing independently of this Act) be as good and valid as they would have been if the husband had concurred.

Court may make order though wife not within Antigua and Barbuda.

3. It shall be lawful for the Court to make any such order, although the wife may not be within Antigua and Barbuda at the time of the making thereof.
