## No. 22 of 1993

AN ACT to amend the Social Security Act, 1972 (No. 3 of 1972)

[ 10th June, 1993. ]

ENACTED by the Parliament of Antigua and Barbuda as follows--

1. This Act may be cited as the Social Security (Amendment) Short title. Act, 1993.

2. The Social Security Act, 1972, is hereby amended by the Provision for old insertion immediately after section 53 thereof of the following -

## "PART VI PAYMENT OF OLD AGE ASSISTANCE

54. (1)Subject to the provisions of this Part any person who, on the coming into force of this Act, has attained the age of sixty five years or more and his total annual income from all sources is less than five thousand dollars shall

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on satisfying the conditions under this Part and the Regulations be eligible to be paid old age assistance at a rate equivalent to the minimum rate paid as age benefit under the Act.

(2) Notwithstanding subsection (1), any person who has attained the age of sixty years and is blind or so disabled that he is unable to earn his livelihood and his total income is less than five thousand dollars per annum shall be eligible to be paid old age assistance at a rate equivalent to the minimum rate paid as age benefit under the Act.

Eligibility for and application for old age

**55.** (1)For the purpose of becomingeligible to receive old age assistance under this **Bat**, an applicant shall —

- (a) be a citizen of Antigua and Barbuda who has ordinarily resided in Antigua and Barbuda for at least fifteen years; or
- (b) be a person who has ordinarily resided in Antigua and Barbuda for at least twenty years preceding the date of application for assistance; and

be a person who is blind or incapacitated and satisfies the conditions in section 54(2) or be a person who satisfies the conditions in section 54(1), as the case may be.

(2) Every application for old age assistance shall be made to the Board in accordance with the conditions and procedure specified in the Regulations.

(3) Regulations made under this Act for purposes of the old age assistance may include —

(a) establishment of an Old Age Assistance Committee to assist in the determination of applications;
