AN ACT to provide Supplementary Appropriation for the services of Antigua and Barbuda for the year 2015 and for other connected purposes.

ENACTED by the Parliament of Antigua and Barbuda as follows –

1. Short title

This Act may be cited as the Supplementary Appropriation (October 2015 to December 2015) Act 2022.

2. Supplementary Appropriation of the sum of Thirty-two Million Two Hundred and Thirty-five Thousand Five Hundred and Seventy-two (\$32,235,572.)

The sums set forth in the Schedule amounting to the sum of Thirty-two Million, Two Hundred and Thirty-five thousand, Five Hundred and Seventy-two dollars (\$32,235,572.) which sums have been drawn from the Consolidated Fund and have been paid for the services of Antigua and Barbuda during the period October 2015 to December 2015 in addition to the sums granted in the Appropriation Act 2015 and the Supplementary Appropriation Act 2015, No. 28 of 2015 are ratified and deemed to have been properly paid and appropriated out of the Consolidated Fund for the sevices mentioned in the Schedule.
