# ANTIGUA AND BARBUDA SUPPLEMENTARY APPROPRIATION (2018) ACT, 2022 No. 18 of 2022

**AN ACT** to provide Supplementary Appropriation for the services of Antigua and Barbuda for the year 2018

**ENACTED** by the Parliament of Antigua and Barbuda as follows —

### 1. Short title

This Act may be cited as the Supplementary Appropriation (2018) Act 2022.

2. Supplementary Appropriation of the sum of One Hundred and Ninety-eight Million One Hundred and Sixty-two Thousand Two Hundred and Twenty-two (\$198,162,222.) Dollars

The sums set forth in the Schedule amounting to the sum of One Hundred and Ninety-eight Million, One Hundred and Sixty-two Thousand, Two Hundred and Twenty-two dollars (\$198,162,222.) which sums have been drawn from the Consolidated Fund and have been paid for the services of Antigua and Barbuda during the year 2018 in addition to the sums granted in the Appropriation Act 2018 are ratified and deemed to have been properly paid and appropriated out of the Consolidated Fund for the services mentioned in the Schedule.
