AN ACT to provide Supplementary Appropriation for the services of Antigua and Barbuda for the year 2019

ENACTED by the Parliament of Antigua and Barbuda as follows —

1. Short title

This Act may be cited as the Supplementary Appropriation (2019) Act 2022.

2. Supplementary Appropriation of the sum of Two Hundred and Twenty-three Million Five Hundred and Thirty-three Thousand Nine Hundred and Thirteen (\$223,533,913.) Dollars

The sums set forth in the Schedule amounting to the sum of Two Hundred and Twenty-three Million, Five Hundred and Thirty-three Thousand, Nine Hundred and Thirteen dollars (\$223,533,913.) which sums have been drawn from the Consolidated Fund and have been paid for the services of Antigua and Barbuda during the year 2019 in addition to the sums granted in the Appropriation Act 2019 are ratified and deemed to have been properly paid and appropriated out of the Consolidated Fund for the services mentioned in the Schedule.
