1. Short title

These Regulations may be cited as The Customs (Prescription of Simplified General Customs Entry Form) Regulations, 2009.

2. Simplified General Customs Entry Form

The form prescribed in the Schedule is the Form to be completed in respect of an entry made under section 26(1) of the Customs Control and Management Act, No. 7 of 1993.

3. Commencement

These regulations come into force on the 9th day of April, 2009.

INSTRUCTIONS FOR COMPLETING DECLARATION FORM

- (1) Please enter the name of the yacht/small vessel/aircraft.
- (2) Please enter the country and registration number of the vessel/aircraft.
- (3) Please describe the colour of the craft and mention its weight class.
- (4) Please indicate the name of the last port visited.
- (5) Please print your name at item 5 in the following order: First Name, Middle Name and then the Last Name.
- (6) Please identify the method of transport for goods imported e.g. FedEx, QuickPack etc.
- (7) Please indicate the Nationality of the method of transport.
- (8) Please provide the Date of Arrival in Antigua and Barbuda.
- (9) Please provide the country of origin of spares/goods declared under item 13.
- (10) Please insert the port of entry; e.g. Deep Water Harbour, Jolly Harbour, etc.
- (11) Please state the number of Packages of spares/goods.
- (12) Please print "X" in the appropriate box or provide details where applicable.
- (13) Briefly describe the goods on board/imported into Antigua & Barbuda and declare the value of those goods.

The following abbreviations are used herein:

EC\$: Eastern Caribbean Dollar

CPC: Customs Procedure Code

Duty: Customs Import Duty

ABST: Antigua and Barbuda Sales Tax

CST: Customs Service Tax


EL: Environment Levy

SWL: Solid Waste Management Levy

WARNING

Section 31 under Part IV of the Customs (Control & Management) Act, 1993 as amended from time to time, prescribes penalties for various offences on the improper importation of goods in to Antigua and Barbuda. These penalties include the forfeiture of goods, a fine of \$5, 000 or three times the value of the goods whichever is the greater amount and or imprisonment for a period of up to 12 months.


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
