By the authority vested in me the Honourable Bertrand Joseph, as Minister of Sports, under section 3(1) (a) of the ICC Cricket World Cup West Indies 2007, Act 2006 ("the Act") I hereby declare the ANTIGUA RECREATION GROUNDS comprising ALL THAT parcel of land in the above mentioned title together with the buildings thereon situate in the city of Saint John's, Antigua the same being delineated on the aerial survey photograph annexed hereto marked "B" signed by the Chief Surveyor as a CWC 2007 Venue with effect from the 12th day of March, 2007 to the 8th day of May, 2007.

Further, by the authority vested in me pursuant to section 3(1) (b) of the Act, I declare the period 27th March, 2007 to 9th April, 2007 as a match period.

Reason for declaration: To declare the Antigua Recreation Grounds as an official Cricket World Cup 2007 practice match venue.
