THE LEGAL PROFESSION REGULATIONS made in exercise of the powers contained in section 15 of the Legal Profession Act, 2008 No. 22 of 2008.

1. Short title

These Regulations may be cited as the Legal Profession Regulations, 2009.

2. Interpretation.

In these Regulations, Act means the Legal Profession Act, 2008 No. 22 of 2008.

3. Admission fees.

The fee to be paid—

- (a) on application for admission to practise law in Antigua and Barbuda under section 16(1) of the Act is \$500;
- (b) on application for admission to practise law in Antigua and Barbuda under section 17(2) of the Act is \$300; and
- (c) to have the name of an Attorney restored to the Roll under section 30(3) of the Act is \$500.

4. Practising Certificate.

The fee to be paid for a practising certificate—

- (a) under section 17(5) of the Act is \$500; and
- (b) on application under section 21(1) of the Act is \$300 for an Attorney-at-law of nine years standing or less than nine years standing and \$500 for an Attorney-at-law of ten years standing and over ten years standing.
