The Police (Pay and Allowances) Regulations, made by the Governor-General under section 71 of the Police Act Cap. 330.

- 1. These Regulations may be cited as the Police (Pay and Short title. Allowances) Regulations, 1996.
- 2. The allowances in the Schedule hereto shall be paid to the Allowances. category of police officers specified therein.
 - 3. The Police Regulations are amended as follows —

Police Regulations Cap. 330 amended.

- in paragraph 16, delete "twenty-four cents a day" and substitute the words "two hundred and fifty dollars (\$250) per month";
- in paragraph 19, delete the words "sixty dollars per annum" and substitute the words "two hundred and fifty dollars (\$250) per month;
- (c) in paragraph 20, delete the words "twenty eight dollars and eighty cents per annum" and substitute the words "one hundred and fifty dollars (\$150) dollars per month".
- (d) paragraph 17 is revoked.
- **4.** These Regulations are deemed to have come into force on Commencement. the 1st day of January, 1996.
