WHEREAS it is proclaimed by section 59 (1) of the Constitution that each session of Parliament shall be held at such place within Antigua and Barbuda and shall begin at such time as the Governor-General shall by proclamation appoint.

NOW THEREFORE, I, JAMES BEETHOVEN CARLISLE, Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of St. Michael and St. George, Governor-General of Antigua and Barbuda, do hereby appoint Parliament Building at Parliament Drive as the place at which the First Session of Parliament shall be held, and 9:00 a.m. on the 22nd day of March, 1999, as the time at which that session shall begin.
