PUBLIC HEALTH ACT (DANGEROUS INFECTIOUS DISEASE) (AMENDMENT) (No. 2) REGULATIONS 2021, made by the Board pursuant to Section 102 of the Public Health Act, Cap. 353.

1. Citation and commencement

(1) These Regulations may be cited as the Public Health Act (Dangerous Infectious Disease) (Amendment) (No. 2) Regulations, 2021.

(2) These Regulations shall be read as an addendum to the Public Health Act (Dangerous Infectious Disease) (Amendment) Regulations 2021, Statutory Instrument No. 5 of 2021 and shall come into effect immediately.

2. Interpretation

In these Regulations –

“principal Regulations” means the Public Health Act (Dangerous Infectious Disease) Regulations 2020, Statutory Instrument No. 16 of 2020

3. Amendment of paragraph 9 of Regulation 5A of principal Regulations.

Regulation 5A of the principal Regulations is amended in paragraph 9 by inserting after subparagraph (4) the following new subparagraph –

“(5) For the period 29th January 2021 to 19th February, 2021 –

- (a) all funeral services and wedding ceremonies, howsoever and wheresoever conducted, shall be limited to a maximum of 25 persons;
- (b) no wake, repast or similar celebration shall be held in respect of the final farewell to any dead.”

“4. Repeals

Paragraphs 17, 18, 19 and 20 of the principal Regulations are repealed
