The Ports of Entry (Jolly Harbour) Order 1994, made by the Cabinet under section 4 of the Trade and Revenue Act (Cap. 274).

- 1. This Order may be cited as the Ports of Entry (Jolly Harbour) Short title. Order, 1994.
- 2. The boundaries set out in the Schedule shall be the bound- Definition of port. aries of the Port of Jolly Harbour.
- 3. The Port of Jolly Harbour in Antigua and Barbuda is hereby declared to be a port of entry for all classes of pleasure vessels including yachts used for Crewed and Bare-boat charter.

SCHEDULE R. 2

All the waters enclosed by an imaginary line starting from the Northern side of the entrance to Jolly Harbour running therefrom South-east (123°-05'-29") for 787.62 meters to the sea wall and thence along the sea wall of Jolly Harbour Marina Southwards to the end of the Jolly Harbour Marina seawall marked by a permanent iron and thence along an imaginary line to the North-east (21°-02'-15") for 69.64 meters and thence along an imaginary line to the North-west (349°-44'-24") for 190.29 meters and thence along an imaginary line to the North-west (325°-52'-17") for 144.55 meters and thence along an imaginary line to the North-west (301°-55'-55") for 710.28 meters to the Southern side of entrance to the Jolly Harbour and finally along an imaginary line to the South-east (106°-34'-00") for 181.85 meters to the said Northern side of the entrance to Jolly Harbour.
