1. Short title

This Order may be cited as the Stamp (Antigua and Barbuda) (400th Anniversary of Rembrandt 1606 — 1669) Order, 2007.

2. Special Stamp

Special stamps of the value and description specified in the Schedule are authorized for sale in Antigua and Barbuda.

3. Duration

The special stamps authorized by this Order shall remain on sale for a period of three (3) months until 19th March, 2007 or until stocks are exhausted, whichever is earlier.

4. Commencement

This Order comes into force on 18th December, 2006.
