The Stamp (Antigua and Barbuda) (Barack Obama-44th President of the United States) Order made in exercise of the powers contained in sections 4 and 5 of the Stamp Act, Cap. 410.

1. Short title

This Order may be cited as the Stamp (Antigua and Barbuda) (Barack Obama-44th President of the United States) Order, 2009.

2. Special Stamps

Special Stamps of the value and description specified in the Schedule are authorized for sale in Antigua and Barbuda.

3. Duration

The Special Stamps authorized by this Order shall remain on sale for a period of three (3) months until 19th April, 2009, or until stocks are exhausted, which ever is earlier.

4. Commencement

This Order comes into force on 20th January, 2009.
