The Stamp (Antigua and Barbuda) (Battle of American Civil War 1861-1865) Order 2001, made by the Cabinet under sections 4 and 5 of the Stamp Act, Cap. 410

1. This Order is cited as the Stamp (Antigua and Barbuda) (Battle of American Civil War 1861-1865) Order, 2002.

Short title.

2. Special stamps each of the value of 45 cents and 50 cents on two sheetlets comprising 12 and 18 stamps; and two souvenir sheets at \$6.00 each are authorised for sale.
