The Stamp (Antigua and Barbuda) (Fine Art) Order, 1993 made by the Cabinet under sections 4 and 5 of the Stamp Act (Cap. 270).

1. Short title. This Order may be cited as the Stamp (Antigua and Barbuda) (Fine Art) Order, 1993.

2. Special stamp. Special stamps of the value of 15c.(a), 15c.(b), 30c., 40c., 60c., \$1.00, \$4.00, \$5.00 and two (2) souvenir sheets of the value of \$6.00 each are authorised for use in Antigua and Barbuda.

3. Design. The design of the stamps authorised by this Order are specified in the Schedule.

4. Duration. The special stamp authorised by this Order shall remain on sale until 21st February, 1994 or until stocks are exhausted whichever is earlier.

5. Commencement. This Order is deemed to have come into force on the 22nd November, 1993.
