THE VEHICLES AND ROAD TRAFFIC (AMENDMENT) REGULATIONS made in exercise of the powers contained in sections 87 of the Vehicles and Road Traffic Act, Cap. 460

### 1. Short title

These Regulations may be cited as the Vehicles and Road Traffic (Amendment) Regulations, 2011.

## 2. Insertion of Regulations 21A, 21B, 21C and 21D

The Vehicles and Road Traffic Regulations are amended by inserting after regulations 21 the following—

"21A Tinted windows and windscreens

Where a person who is the owner of a motor vehicle drives or permits another person to drive the motor vehicle he shall ensure that where the windscreen or window of the motor vehicle has tint or film applied—

- (i) the front side windows shall be of a grade which allows a minimum of thirty five percent visual transmission of light through the glass;
- (ii) the front windscreen, not exceeding 6 inches down from the top of the windscreen, shall be of a grade which allows a minimum of twenty percent visual transmission of light through the glass;
- (iii) the rear windscreen and rear side windows shall be of a grade which allows a minimum of thirty five percent visual transmission of light through the glass.

## 21B Commercial signs and decals on windscreens

(1) Where a person who is the owner of a motor vehicle drives or permits another person to drive the motor vehicle he shall ensure that where the windscreen of the motor vehicle has a commercial sign or decal applied—

- (i) the size on the front windscreen shall not exceed 6 inches from the top of the windscreen;
- (ii) the size on the rear windscreen shall not exceed 2 inches in height and 6 inches in width from the top of the windscreen.
- (2) Where a person who is the owner of a motor vehicle drives or permits another person to drive the motor vehicle he shall ensure that the front and rear side windows do not have commercial sign or decal applied.

### 21C Tint Meter

The percentage of visual transmission of light shall be determined by a tint meter measuring device, or any other device approved by the General Manager or Traffic Commissioner as capable of measuring the percentage of light passing through the windscreen or window.

## 21D Exceptions to provisions respecting tint

- (1) These Regulations do not apply to a motor vehicle where the rear windscreen or rear windows are of manufactured tinted glass, with a minimum of 20 percent visual transmission of light, and installed on the vehicle before the commencement of these Regulations.
  - (2) The following classes of motor vehicles are exempt from Regulations 21A and 21B—
    - (a) motor vehicles assigned for use by the Royal Police Force of Antigua and Barbuda;
    - (b) motor vehicles assigned for use by the Antigua and Barbuda Defence Force;
    - (c) motor vehicles assigned for use by the Office of National Drug and Money Laundering Control Policy;
    - (d) motor vehicles used by the Ministry of Foreign Affairs for the transportation of visiting dignitaries;
  - (e) fire trucks;
  - (f) ambulances;
  - (g) armoured security vehicles;
  - (h) hearses; and
