THE VEHICLES AND ROAD TRAFFIC (TRAFFIC SIGNS) (AMENDMENT) REGULATIONS made in exercise of the powers contained in section 87 of the Vehicles and Road Traffic Act, Cap. 460.

1. Short title

These Regulations may be cited as the Vehicles and Road Traffic (Traffic Signs) (Amendment) Regulations, 2015.

2. Interpretation

In these Regulations, "principal Regulations" means the Vehicles and Road Traffic (Traffic Signs) Regulations 1974, S.I. No. 38 of 1974.

3. Amendment of Regulation 20

- (1) The principal Regulations are amended in section 20 by inserting after regulation 20 (1) paragraph (a) the following paragraph—
 - "(b) when a vehicle is being used for fire brigade, ambulance, bomb or explosive disposal, or police purposes and the observance of the prohibition conveyed by the red signal in accordance with paragraph (a) would be likely to hinder the use of that vehicle for the purposes for which it is being used, then paragraph (a) shall not apply to the vehicle, and the red signal shall convey the prohibition that vehicle shall not proceed beyond the stop line in a manner or at a time likely to endanger any person or to cause the driver of any vehicle proceeding in accordance with the indications of light signals operating in association with the signal to change its speed or course in order to avoid an accident;".
- (2) The principal Regulations are amended in section 20 by renumbering paragraph "(t)" as paragraph "(c)" and all other subsequent paragraphs to be renumbered in consecutive alphabetical order as follows—

Paragraph "(c)" becomes paragraph "(a)" paragraph "becomes paragraph "(e)".
