The Work Permit (Fees) Order 1997 made by the Minister under section F10 of the Antigua and Barbuda Labour Code Cap. 27.

1. This Order may be cited as the Work Permit (Fees) Order, 1997. Short title.

2. A person within any of the categories of persons mentioned in the first column of the Schedule to this Order shall pay into the Consolidated Fund for every work permit granted to that person the fee prescribed in the second and third column opposite to that category. Fees for Work Permits.

3. The Work Permit (Fees) Order, Cap. 27 is revoked. Revocation of Work Permit (Fees) Order, Cap. 27 (S.I. No. 24 of 1985).
