How application is to be made

1 Every application will be made to the Board in writing as soon as possible after the event on a form obtainable from the Board's office.

Notice of date for hearing

2 The applicant and the Attorney-General will be given notice by the Board's Secretary of the date set for hearing.

Attorney-General's case

3 At least 14 days before the hearing notice of the nature and substance of any case to be presented by way of opposition to the applicant's claim shall be given by the Attorney-General.
