**PART I
PRELIMINARY**

1. These Regulations may be cited as the Gaming Title.
Regulations.

2. In these Regulations, unless the context otherwise Interpretation.
requires, the following expressions have the meaning hereby
assigned to them respectively, that is to say —

“Act” means the Lotteries and Gaming Act; Ch. 387.

“The Board” means the Gaming Board for the Bahama Islands established under the Act;

“credit slip” means a form used to record an amount of money or chips removed from a gaming table and placed in a cashier’s cage;

“drop box” means a security container attached to a gaming table during play, which may contain money, chips, credit slips or fill slips, and to which access is restricted by the use of locks or locking devices;

“fill slips” means a form used to record an amount of money or chips furnished to a gaming table from the cashier’s cage;

“licensed premises” means any premises in respect of which a licence under Part IV of the Act is for the time being in force.
