Interpretation.

- "the Act" means the Immigration Act, and "section" means section of the Act;
- "dependant" means the wife or child of a person who is not a citizen of The Bahamas, where such wife or child is not engaging, or is not proposing to engage, in gainful occupation in The Bahamas;
- "passenger" means any person carried on a passenger ship other than a person employed or engaged in any capacity on board the ship on the business of the ship;
