# MINISTRY OF FOREIGN AFFAIRS (CONSULAR SERVICES) (FEES) REGULATIONS

## (SECTION 13)

[Commencement 11th May, 2015]

- 1. These Regulations may be cited as the Ministry Citation. of Foreign Affairs (Consular Services) (Fees) Regulations.
- **2.** In these Regulations, "Children's Passport", Interpretation. "Frequent Traveller's Passport" and "Regular Passport", respectively have the same meanings as in the Passport Rules.
- **3.** The fees to be charged for the consular services Fees for consular rendered by the Ministry of Foreign Affairs shall be as specified in the Schedule.
- **4.** The Ministry of Foreign Affairs (Consular Repeal. Services) (Fees) Rules are repealed.
