PARLIAMENTARY ELECTIONS (ENUMERATION FORMS) REGULATIONS

(SECTION 113)

[Commencement 2nd June, 1992]

Citation.

1. These Regulations may be cited as the Parliamentary Elections (Enumeration Forms) Regulations.

Forms to be used by scrutineer.

First Schedule.

Person interviewed to sign form.

2. A scrutineer shall for the purpose of carrying out an enquiry under section 16(1) of the Act utilise the Form set out in the First Schedule.

- **3.** Upon completion of an enquiry of a person whose name appears on the register of the polling division to which the scrutineer was appointed or of a person whose name should be on the register, but who is not registered, a scrutineer shall
 - (a) request that person to affix his signature to the appropriate Form of the First Schedule duly completed by the scrutineer; and

- (b) leave a copy of the duly completed Form with that person.
- **4.** Forms 1 to 3 in the Second Schedule shall be utilised by a scrutineer for the purpose of evidencing the names, numbers and other particulars of persons of whom enquiries were made by a scrutineer under section 16(1) of the Act and of indicating his visit to premises at which no one was present.

Second Schedule.

5. A scrutineer shall upon completion of the duties assigned to him pursuant to section 16 return all forms supplied to him to the office of the Parliamentary Commissioner.

Return of forms and records.

6. The Parliamentary Commissioner may utilise Form 4 of the Second Schedule for the purpose of making a request of a chief occupant of a house pursuant to section 17(1) of the Act.
