

PARLIAMENTARY ELECTIONS REGULATIONS

*S.I. 23/1992
S.I. 38/2007*

(SECTION 113)

[Commencement 30th March, 1992]

1. These Regulations may be cited as the Parliamentary Elections Regulations.

Citation.

2. An oath taken by a voter pursuant to the provisions of section 59(4)(b) of the Parliamentary Elections Act shall be in the form prescribed in the Schedule to these Regulations.

Form of oath prescribed.

3. (1) No person shall use any recording device, cellular phone, camera or other photographic equipment in or on a polling place during the hours when balloting is being conducted at that polling place.

Prohibition of cell phones etc. *S.I. 38/2007.*

(2) Any person who contravenes any of the provisions of this regulation shall be guilty of an offence and liable on summary conviction to a fine not exceeding five hundred dollars or a term of imprisonment not exceeding six months or to both such fine and imprisonment.

SCHEDULE (Regulation 2)

FORM OF OATH TO BE TAKEN BY INJURED VOTER

PARLIAMENTARY ELECTIONS (ENUMERATION FORMS) REGULATIONS

(SECTION 113)

[Commencement 2nd June, 1992]

Citation.

1. These Regulations may be cited as the Parliamentary Elections (Enumeration Forms) Regulations.

Forms to be used by scrutineer.

First Schedule.

2. A scrutineer shall for the purpose of carrying out an enquiry under section 16(1) of the Act utilise the Form set out in the First Schedule.

Person interviewed to sign form.

3. Upon completion of an enquiry of a person whose name appears on the register of the polling division to which the scrutineer was appointed or of a person whose name should be on the register, but who is not registered, a scrutineer shall —

- (a) request that person to affix his signature to the appropriate Form of the First Schedule duly completed by the scrutineer; and
