## PUBLIC HOLIDAYS ACT (CHAPTER 36)

### PUBLIC HOLIDAYS (MAJORITY RULE DAY, 2015) (VARIATION) ORDER, 2015

**WHEREAS** by paragraph (a) of section 4 of the Public Holidays Act (“the Act”) it is provided that it shall be lawful for the Governor-General when it is made to appear to the Governor-General in any special case that in any year it is inexpedient that a day appointed as a public holiday should be a public holiday, to declare by order to be published in the Gazette that such day shall not in such year be a public holiday and, if necessary, to appoint such other day as the Governor-General may deem fit to be a public holiday instead of such day, and thereupon the day so appointed shall in such year be substituted for the day so appointed by the Act;

**AND WHEREAS** the 10<sup>th</sup> day of January has been appointed a public holiday under the Act;

**AND WHEREAS** it is considered necessary and deemed fit by the Governor-General to appoint another day in 2015 to be a public holiday for the celebration of Majority Rule Day instead of the 10<sup>th</sup> day of January, 2015:

**NOW THEREFORE**, in exercise of the powers conferred by paragraph (a) of section 4 of the Act, the Governor-General makes the following Order —

**1. Citation.**

This Order may be cited as the Public Holidays (Majority Rule Day, 2015) (Variation) Order, 2015.

**2. Monday 12<sup>th</sup> January, 2015 to be celebrated as Majority Rule Day.**

Saturday, the 10<sup>th</sup> day of January, 2015, shall not be a public holiday for the celebration of Majority Rule Day and instead of that day, Monday, the 12<sup>th</sup> day of January, 2015, shall be celebrated as Majority Rule Day and a public holiday.
