**1.** This Order may be cited as the Currency (Notes and Coins) Order.

Title.

**2.** In this Order, unless the context otherwise requires —

Interpretation.

“Act” means the Central Bank of The Bahamas Act;

“Bank” means the Central Bank of The Bahamas established by section 3 of the Act;

“numismatic coins” means proof coins which are issued in packaged sets of nine coins with one of each denomination and proof coins issued singularly;

“regular issue coins” means coins for general circulation and includes brilliant uncirculated specimens of such coins which are issued in packaged sets of nine coins with one of each denomination and brilliant uncirculated specimens of such coins issued singularly.

**3.** The denominations, forms and designs of the currency notes issued by the Bank, and the devices to be borne by such notes, shall be as specified in the First Schedule to this Order.

Denominations, forms and assigns of currency notes. First Schedule.

**4.** The denominations, forms, designs, standard weight and composition of, and the tolerance and variation permitted in respect of, the coins issued by the Bank, and the devices to be borne by such coins shall be as specified in the Second Schedule to this Order.
