1. This Order may be cited as the Customs Regulations (Sufferance Wharf) Order, 1959.
2. The place mentioned in the Schedule to this Order is hereby appointed a sufferance wharf for the lading and unloading of goods by sufferance.

**CUSTOMS REGULATIONS (SUFFERANCE

[Commencement 11th May, 1963]

1. This Order may be cited as the Customs Regulations (Sufferance Wharves) Order, 1963.
2. The places mentioned in the Schedule to this Order are hereby, subject to such restrictions as are specified thereunder in the said Schedule, appointed sufferance wharves for the lading and unloading of goods by sufferance.

SCHEDULE**BLUE HOLE POINT, SOUTH SIDE, NASSAU:
RESTRICTIONS**

- (a) Twenty-four hours advance notice shall be given to the Customs Department.
- (b) Ships owned and operated by Bahamas Construction Equipment Limited only shall be allowed to use the wharf.
- (c) Transportation of customs officers shall be provided by the said Company.

- (d) At the conclusion of the operations of the said Company the use of the wharf shall cease.

CLIFTON PIER, Dock of Bahamas Gas Company.

RESTRICTIONS

- (a) Twenty-four hours advance notice shall be given to the Customs Department.
- (b) Barges carrying gas operated by Bahamas Gas Company only shall be allowed to use the wharf.
- (c) Transportation of customs officers shall be provided by the said Company.
