**JUDGES' REMUNERATION AND PENSIONS ACT

**JUDGES' REMUNERATION AND PENSIONS ACT
(ALLOWANCES)(AMENDMENT) ORDER, 2013**

In exercise of the powers conferred by section 3(2) of the Judges' Remuneration and Pensions Act (*Ch. 45*), the Governor-General makes the following Order—

1. Citation, Sub. Leg. Vol. 1, Ch. 45-3.

This Order, which amends the Judges' Remuneration and Pensions (Allowances) Order, 1994, may be cited as the Judges' Remuneration and Pensions (Allowances)(Amendment) Order, 2013.

2. Amendment of paragraph 2 of the principal Order.

Paragraph 2 of the principal Order is amended by the deletion of subparagraph (1)(a) and (c) and the substitution therefor of the following—

- “(a) the Chief Justice, to free government furnished quarters or in lieu thereof with effect from 1st July, 2012 a housing allowance of \$25,000 per annum, and the payment of any utility bills connected thereto;
- (c) any Justice, other than as mentioned in subparagraphs (a) and (b), to subsidized rental government quarters or in lieu thereof, with effect from 1st July, 2012, a housing allowance of \$25,000 per annum and the payment of utility bills not exceeding \$1,200 per month connected with the residence of the Justice.”.

3. Amendment of paragraph 4B of the principal Order.

Paragraph 4B of the principal Order is repealed and replaced by the following—

“4B. Educational allowance.

The Chief Justice and every judge shall be entitled to an allowance for a dependent child, not exceeding two, equal to the tuition fee prevailing at the College of The Bahamas with respect to the dependent's attendance at college, university or any professional school for a period not exceeding four years:

Provided at least two of those years may be applied to high school and secondary education.”.
