The Minister, in exercise of the powers conferred by section 13 of the Ministry of Foreign Affairs Act, makes the following Regulations —

1. Citation.

These Regulations may be cited as the Ministry of Foreign Affairs (Consular Services) (Fees) Regulations, 2015.

2. Interpretation.

In these Regulations, "Children's Passport", "Frequent Traveller's Passport" and "Regular Passport", respectively have the same meanings as in the Passport Rules¹.

3. Fees for consular services.

The fees to be charged for the consular services rendered by the Ministry of Foreign Affairs shall be as specified in the *Schedule*.

4. Repeal.

The Ministry of Foreign Affairs (Consular Services) (Fees) Rules² are repealed.
