**POLICE (FEES FOR SPECIAL SERVICES)
(AMENDMENT) REGULATIONS, 1984**

SI 26/1984

(SECTION 104(2))

[Commencement 28th June, 1984]

Citation

1. These Regulations which amend the Police (Fees For Special Services) Regulations, may be cited as the Police (Fees For Special Services) (Amendment) Regulations, 1984.

Amends S I No
181 of 1965

2. The principal Regulations are amended in the following respects —

- (a) in paragraph (1) of regulation 3 —
 - (i) by deleting the words, “a sum equal to two-thirds of the fee so paid”;
 - (ii) by inserting after the word “pay” the words “such fee”;
- (b) by deleting paragraph (2) of regulation 3;
- (c) by deleting the Schedule and substituting the following therefor —

**ROYAL BAHAMAS POLICE FORCE AND RESERVE
(AWARD OF MEDALS) REGULATIONS**

SI 60/1979

(SECTION 104)

[Commencement 27th September, 1979]

1. These Regulations may be cited as the Royal Bahamas Police Force and Reserve (Award of Medals) Regulations. Citation

2. (1) There shall be in respect of the Force three medals, namely — Medals

- (a) the Medal for Gallantry;
- (b) the Medal for Meritorious Service; and
- (c) the Medal for Long Service and Good Conduct.

(2) There shall be, in respect of the Reserve, a Medal for Faithful Service.

(3) Each of the medals specified in paragraphs (1) and (2) shall be reproduced as a miniature and —

- (a) shall be known as a “miniature medal”;
- (b) shall be approximately half the size of the medal from which it is reproduced;
- (c) may be worn on certain occasions by the person to whom the medal is awarded.

3. (1) Each of the medals specified in paragraph (1) of regulation 2 shall be a circular silver medal one and three eighths ($1\frac{3}{8}$) inches in diameter bearing on the obverse the Coat of Arms of The Bahamas, on the reverse an Description of medals
