- 2. - (a) the names, addresses and occupation of the parties and witnesses:

 - (ii) any defence or counter-charge, in support of which evidence has been given;
- (c) submissions on any point of law arising in the course of the proceedings and the decision of the court thereon; and
- (d) the judgment of the court and any observations made by the judge in giving judgment.

Penalty.

4. A person who contravenes the provisions of this Act is guilty of an offence and liable on summary conviction before a Resident Magistrate to a fine not exceeding five thousand dollars or to imprisonment for a term not exceeding six months, or to both such fine and imprisonment.

Consent of Director of Public Prosecutions, 5. No prosecution for an offence against this Act shall be commenced by any person unless the Director of Public Prosecutions consents thereto.

Exemption of certain documents from operation of Act.

- 6. Nothing in this Act shall apply to—
 - (a) the printing of any pleading, transcript of evidence or other document for use in connection with any judicial proceedings or the communication thereof to persons concerned in such judicial proceedings;
 - (b) the printing or publishing of any notice or report pursuant to a direction of the court;
 - (c) the printing or publishing in any separate volume or part of any bona fide series of law reports of any matter which does not form part of any other publication and, subject to section 3, consists solely of reports of proceedings in courts of law;
 - (d) the printing or publishing of any matter, subject to section 3. in any publication of a technical character bona fide intended for circulation among members of the legal or medical profession; or
 - (e) the printing or publishing of any extract from law reports referred to in paragraph (c) or from any publication referred to in paragraph (d).
