AN ACT to Amend the Constabulary Force Act.

[27th Jebruary, 2007

BE IT ENACTED by The Queen's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Senate and House of Representatives of Jamaica, and by the authority of the same, as follows:--

1. This Act may be cited as the Constabulary Force (Amendment) Short title Act, 2007, and shall be read and construed as one with the and con-Constabulary Force Act (hereinafter referred to as the principal Act) and all amendments thereto.

2. The Regulations set out in the First Schedule to the principal Amendment Act are amended in paragraph (4) by deleting the full stop appearing at the end of regulation (c) and substituting therefor a semi-colon principal and inserting the following as sub-paragraphs (d) and (e)—

Schedule to Act

"(d) in respect of any person transferred from the Island Special Constabulary Force, and enlisted in the Jamaica Constabulary Force on or after the 27th day of February, 1998, the periods referred to in sub-paragraphs 1(a) and

- (b) shall be deemed to include any period during which the person had been a Special Constable in regular employment in the Island Special Constabulary Force, as if that person were during that period a Constable in the Force;
- (e) the term--
  - "Island Special Constabulary Force" means the force constituted under section 16 of the Constables (Special) Act;
  - (ii) "regular employment" has the meaning assigned to it by section 31 of that Act; and
  - (iii) "Special Constable" has the meaning assigned to it by section 15 of that Act.".
