AN ACT to Amend the Employment (Termination and Redundancy Payments) Act.

BE IT ENACTED by The Queen's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Senate and House of Representatives of Jamaica, and by the authority of the same, as follows:----

1. This Act may be cited as the Employment (Termination and Short tutle and con-Redundancy Payments) (Amendment) Act, 2008, and shall be read struction and construed as one with the Employment (Termination and Redundancy Payments) Act (hereinafter referred to as the "principal Act") and all amendments thereto.

- [No.] The Employment (Termination and Redundancy Payments) (Amendment) Act, 2008
 - 2. Section 9 of the principal Act is amended—
 - (a) in subsection (2), by deleting the words "one hundred" and substituting therefor the words "two hundred and fifty thousand"; and
 - (b) in subsection (3)—
 - (i) by deleting the words "one hundred" and substituting therefor the words "two hundred and fifty thousand"; and
 - (ii) by deleting all the words appearing after the words "three months".

3. Subsection (2) of section 16 of the principal Act is amended by deleting the words "three hundred" and substituting therefor the words "two hundred and fifty thousand".

4. Section 17 of the principal Act is amended by—

- (a) renumbering the section as subsection (1); and
- (b) deleting from subsection (1) as renumbered the words "the amount claimed does not exceed seven thousand dollars" and substituting therefor the words "the amount of each claim does not exceed one million dollars"; and
- (c) inserting next after subsection (1) as renumbered the following as subsection (2)—

" (2) The Minister may, by order subject to affirmative resolution, increase the amount specified in subsection (1).".

5. The principal Act is amended by inserting next after section 17 the following as section 17A—

^{*}Minister may amend monetary penalties. 17A. The Minister may, by order subject to affirmative resolution, amend the monetary penalties specified in this Act.".

6. Section 18 of the principal Act is amended by inserting next Amendment after subsection (2) the following as subsection (3)-

(3) Regulations made under this section may provide for the imposition of penalties on summary conviction before a Resident Magistrate, of a fine not exceeding one million dollars or imprisonment for a term not exceeding twelve months or of both such fine and imprisonment.".

7. The Employment (Termination and Redundancy Payments) Amendment Regulations, 1974, are amended by-

- (a) renumbering regulation 11 as regulation 12; and
- inserting next after regulation 10 the following as regulation Regulations, (b) 11---

"Information 11.--(1) An employer who dismisses to Minister or proposes to dismiss his employee by re dismissal reason of redundancy shall submit to the on redundancy. Minister, in writing-

- (a) the effective date of the dismissal;
- (b) the name and address of the employee;
- (c) the amount which is payable to the employee;
- (d) the name, description and type of the employee's post; and
- (e) a statement as to whether the employee is a member of a union and if so, the name of the union with which the employee is affiliated.

(2) The information referred to in paragraph (1) shall be submitted to the Minister within twenty-one days of the date the decision to dismiss was made.
