

THE CORONERS ACT

ORDER
(under section 4)THE EXTENDED JURISDICTION IN CLARENDON OF THE RESIDENT
MAGISTRATE FOR MANCHESTER AS CORONER ORDER, 1934*(Made by the Governor on the 25th day of June, 1934)*

1. This Order may be cited as the Extended Jurisdiction in Clarendon of the Resident Magistrate for Manchester as Coroner Order, 1934.

2. The area set out in the Schedule is hereby prescribed to be the area in the parish of Clarendon over which the jurisdiction of the Resident Magistrate for Manchester as Coroner shall extend. Schedule.

SCHEDULE

(Paragraph 2)

From the point on the Yankee River where the four parishes, Manchester, Clarendon, St. Ann and Trelawny meet, down the centre of the Yankee River to its confluence with the Cave River; thence down the centre of the Cave River to where it is crossed by the parochial road leading from Borobridge through Morgan's Forest to Harwood; thence southerly along the centre of the said parochial road to its junction with the new main road from Alston via Tweedside to Grantham; thence south-easterly along the centre of the said main road to the White Rock River; thence up the centre of the White Rock River to the eastern boundary of Harwood's Patent; thence southerly along the eastern boundary of Harwood's Patent to the boundary of Liecesterfield; thence easterly and southerly along the boundary between Liecesterfield and Logie Green to the Rio Minho; thence up the centre of the Rio Minho to the main road from Ritchie to Spaldings at or near the Moravian Church; thence southerly along the centre of the said main road to its junction with the parochial road leading to Ginger Hall between the 7th and 8th mile posts; thence westerly along the centre of the said parochial road to the boundary of the parishes of Manchester and Clarendon; thence north-westerly along the said parish boundary back to the starting point.
