THE PARLIAMENT (INTEGRITY OF MEMBERS) REGULATIONS, 1975 (Made by the Integrity Commission on the 10th day of February, 1975) L.N. 63175

- 1. These Regulations may be cited as the Parliament (Integrity Citation. of Members) Regulations, 1975.
 - 2. Every Parliamentarian shall, in writing—

- (a) within thirty days after the date on which he becomes a of Parlia-Parliamentarian, furnish to the Commission particulars of his correct postal address; and
- (b) within fourteen days after any change in such address, give notice to the Commission of the new address.
- 3. The Commission shall keep and maintain a Register of Parlia- Register of mentarians in which shall be recorded the following particulars and mentarians. such other particulars as the Commission may from time to time approve---

- (a) the name and address of every Parliamentarian:
- (b) the date on which he was elected or appointed to Parliament:
- (c) the date on which he ceases to be a Parliamentarian:
- (d) the date of receipt of the declaration required to be furnished by each Parliamentarian pursuant to section 4 of the Act.
- 4.—(1) Identification cards duly signed by the Chairman of the Identification Commission shall be issued to the members and employees of the Commission.

(2) Where for the purpose of performing duties under the Act members of the Commission or employees are required to visit or inspect private premises they shall produce to the owner or occupier of such premises their identification cards.

Enquiries under section 7 of the Act.

- 5.—(1) Where the Commission considers that it is necessary to hold an enquiry under subsection (1) of section 7 of the Act, it shall fix a date for the holding of the enquiry and the Secretary shall serve on the Parliamentarian a notice in writing which shall—
 - (a) specify the nature and scope of the matters to be considered;
 - (b) state the date, time and place at which the enquiry will be held.
- (2) The enquiry shall be fixed for a date not less than twenty-one days from the date of the notice.
- (3) The notice may be delivered personally to the Parliamentarian or may be sent by registered post to his postal address as notified to the Commission pursuant to regulation 2.
- (4) The notice shall indicate the right of the Parliamentarian to be accompanied and represented by an attorney-at-law and a registered public accountant.
