THE UNIVERSITY HOSPITAL ACT
BY-LAWS

(under section 8)

THE UNIVERSITY HOSPITAL (SECURITY) BY-LAWS, 1999

(Made by the University Hospital Board of Management with the approval of the Minister on the 20th day of December, 1999)

L.N 167d/99

1. These By-Laws may be cited as the University Hospital (Security) By-Laws, 1999.

2. In these By-Laws—

“Hospital premises” means that area of land on which are situated the University Hospital, the nurses’ and doctors’ residences, the school of nursing and the University of the West Indies Faculty of Medicine and borders with the Water Commission aqueduct which runs from north to south on the western side, Golding Avenue which runs from south to north on the eastern side and curving westward at the northern point and the University of the West Indies Mona Campus on the southern end;

“restricted area” means any part of the Hospital premises so designated by the Board with a sign stating “Restricted Area”;

“security officer” means—

- (a) an employee who performs security duties; or
- (b) a person assigned to the Hospital to perform security duties by the security company to which he is employed, being a company contracted by the Board to carry out security services at the Hospital.

3. No person shall carry on any business or trade on the Hospital premises except with the approval of the Board and in accordance with such terms and conditions as the Board may impose.

4. No person shall on the Hospital premises, solicit for any purpose except with the permission of the Board and on such terms and conditions as the Board may impose.

5. No person shall post or display any advertisement, circular or placard or paint any word or picture on, or distribute any matter in, any part of the Hospital premises without the permission of the Board.

6. No person shall take any still, motion or sound picture of any part of the Hospital premises without the permission of the Board and under such terms and conditions as the Board may impose.

7. No person in the Hospital, other than—

- (a) an employee so authorized by the Board;
- (b) a security officer;
- (c) a member of the Jamaica Constabulary Force, the Jamaica Defence Force, or the Jamaica Fire Brigade, while on the Hospital premises in that capacity,

shall operate any radio or wireless transmitting or receiving equipment or apparatus on the Hospital premises without the permission of the Board and in such manner and under such conditions as the Board may impose.

8.—(1) No person, other than an employee who works in a restricted area or a security officer on duty at the Hospital, may enter or remain in a restricted area unless authorized by the Board.

(2) A person, not being an employee or a person authorized under paragraph (1), shall, while in a restricted area on the request of a security officer on duty at the Hospital—

- (a) state his name and address;
- (b) produce a valid identification; and
- (c) produce a valid document, if any, attesting to the purpose of his presence in and the authority upon which he entered the area.

(3) A person who fails to comply with a request under paragraph (2) may be ordered by the security officer to leave the restricted area; and where he fails to leave he may be liable to be physically removed therefrom by the security officer or such other person acting in aid of the security officer with such force as may be reasonably necessary in the circumstances.

(4) No person shall drive into or park, or use or operate a motor vehicle in restricted area without the approval of the Board.

(5) A person who is authorized under paragraph (1) to be in a restricted area shall, while in that area, follow any instructions given by the security officer on duty.

9.—(1) Any person who walks, rides or drives onto the Hospital premises—

- (a) shall use the roads, paved walkways or paths provided for that purpose; and
- (b) shall not obstruct the proper use of any road, paved walkway or path.

(2) Any person who operates a vehicle on the Hospital premises shall—

- (a) do so in a manner that does not cause harm or danger to any person thereon;
- (b) park in the places identified for such parking; and
- (c) follow any directions for parking given by a security officer.

10.—(1) No person shall operate a motor vehicle for hire or rental on the Hospital premises except with the permission of the Board and in accordance with such terms or conditions as the Board may impose.

(2) Where a motor vehicle is operated for hire it shall, when not in operation, be parked in the area designated for such vehicles or at such other place as a security officer may direct.

11. Nothing in these By-Laws shall prevent a driver of a motor vehicle, in response to an emergency involving danger to life or property, from operating that motor vehicle on the Hospital premises in a manner necessitated by that emergency.

12.—(1) The Chief Security Officer shall, after consultation with the Hospital Administrator, cause to be placed, erected or displayed on the Hospital premises, such signs as are considered necessary for the proper direction, control and regulation of vehicular traffic thereon.

(2) Any person operating a motor vehicle on the Hospital premises shall comply with the traffic signs thereon.

(3) Pedestrians on the Hospital premises who are within pedestrian lane markings have the right of way over vehicular traffic.

(4) No person shall load or unload any vehicle on the Hospital premises except at such places as may be designated for that purpose.

(5) No person shall, while under the influence of alcohol, an intoxicating substance or a narcotic drug, operate or be in control of any motor vehicle or motorized equipment on the Hospital premises.

13.—(1) No person, other than a person seeking medical attention or who is being medically evaluated or is a patient in the Hospital, shall enter onto or remain on the Hospital premises while he is under the influence of alcohol, an intoxicating substance or narcotic drug.

(2) No person shall commit any disorderly, obscene or indecent act or cause any nuisance or disturbance on the Hospital premises.

(3) No person shall, without reasonable cause, have in his possession any narcotic drug while he is on the Hospital premises.

14.—(1) No person shall engage in or organize any form of gambling on the Hospital premises.

(2) No person shall operate, cause to be operated or be involved in the operation of any gambling device on the Hospital premises.

15. No person shall—

- (a) deposit or dispose of any litter, garbage, refuse, cigarette, cigar, matches or other material or article on the Hospital premises, except in a receptacle provided for that purpose;
- (b) use any sanitary convenience on the Hospital premises otherwise than in a clean, tidy and sanitary manner.

16. No person shall—

- (a) destroy or damage any building, sign, fence, pipe, hose, coupling post, gate, equipment marker or other structure on the Hospital premises;
- (b) lay any wire, cable, fence, pipeline, net or any other material or dig, excavate, bore or lay any road, track or path on the Hospital premises without being so authorized by the Board.

17. No person shall interfere with, tamper with or damage any part of the Hospital premises or any equipment, machinery, motor vehicle or appliance which is located thereon.

18.—(1) Subject to paragraph (2), a security officer, a member of the Jamaica Constabulary Force or the Jamaica Defence Force, while on duty, may have on the Hospital premises a firearm, ammunition, explosives or inflammable material.

(2) A person, other than a person mentioned in paragraph (1), who has in his possession a firearm or ammunition shall declare that fact to the security officer who is stationed on duty at the Hospital entrance.

(3) A security officer stationed on duty at the Hospital entrance who has a reasonable suspicion that a person is entering the Hospital premises with a firearm may require that person to immediately leave the premises.

19. No person, other than a person specified in paragraph 18(1), shall, without lawful authority, have in his possession while on the Hospital premises any weapon which is capable of causing harm or inflicting pain or injury to another person.

20. No person shall smoke in any of the following areas of the Hospital—

- (a) a ward;
- (b) an operating theatre;
- (c) the intensive care unit;
- (d) a patient care accommodation and treatment area; and
- (e) any place where a “No Smoking” sign is displayed.

21. A security officer on duty at the Hospital may, in enforcing these By-Laws, remove any person from the Hospital premises with such force as may be necessary in the circumstances of the case.

22. A person who contravenes or fails to comply with any of these By-Laws is liable on summary conviction before a Resident Magistrate to a fine or to imprisonment as prescribed in the University Hospital Act.

THE UNIVERSITY HOSPITAL (BLUE CROSS PATIENTS FEES)
REGULATIONS, 1963

(Made by the University Hospital Board of Management with the approval of the Minister on the 7th day of April, 1964) L.N. 230/64

[1st May, 1963.]

1. These Regulations may be cited as the University Hospital (Blue Cross Patients Fees) Regulations, 1963.

2. In these Regulations—

“Board” means the University Hospital Board of Management constituted under the Act;

“Hospital” means the University Hospital established pursuant to the provisions of the Act;

“Blue Cross patients” means the patients receiving medical treatment under the Blue Cross Scheme operated by the Federated Health Insurance Association Limited;

“income” means—

- (a) in relation to an unmarried patient, the net income of such patient;
- (b) in relation to a married patient, the joint net income of the patient and the husband or wife of such patient, as the case may be;
- (c) in relation to a child patient, the joint net income of the parents or guardians of such child patient:

Provided that in the computation of income a deduction of \$1.00 per week each shall be made in respect of a wife and every dependent.

Schedule.

3. The fees to be paid by the Federated Health Insurance Association Limited in respect of Blue Cross patients of the Hospital for services and materials provided by the Board shall be as specified in Part I, Part II, Part III and Part IV of the Schedule, notwithstanding a patient is an out-patient or hospitalized in a private room or a public ward:

Provided that the Federated Health Insurance Association Limited shall not be liable to pay any fees for any period in any one year in excess of an aggregate period of ninety days during which a Blue Cross patient is hospitalized.

4. These Regulations shall not apply to a patient who is entitled to claim under the Motor Vehicles Insurance (Third-Party Risks) Act as a result of an accident.

THE UNIVERSITY HOSPITAL (FEES) REGULATIONS, 1965

(Made by the University Hospital Board of Management with the approval of the Minister on the 5th day of May, 1965) L.N. 181/65

[15th June, 1965.]

1. These Regulations may be cited as the University Hospital (Fees) Regulations, 1965.

2. In these Regulations—

“Board” means the University Hospital Board of Management constituted under the Act;

“Hospital” means the University Hospital established pursuant to the provisions of the Act;

“Income” means—

- (a) in relation to an unmarried patient, the net income of such patient;
- (b) in relation to a married patient, the joint net income of the patient and the husband or wife of such patient as the case may be;
- (c) in relation to a child patient, the joint net income of the parents or guardians of such child patient:

Provided that in the computation of net income for the cases at (a) and (b) above, such net income shall be regarded as the income remaining after allowing a deduction of \$1.00 per week in respect of each unemployed dependent of the unmarried patient or the husband and/or wife of the married patient, respectively.

3. The fees to be paid by patients of the Hospital and by patients of any private practitioner for services and materials provided by the Board shall be as specified in the Schedule.
