A BILL

To amend the Control of Stray Dogs Act

ENACTED by the Parliament of Mauritius, as follows -

1. Short title

This Act may be cited as the Control of Stray Dogs (Amendment) Act 2003.

2. Interpretation

In this Act –

"principal Act" means the Control of Stray Dogs Act 2000.

3. Section 2 of principal Act amended

Section 2 of the principal Act is amended –

(a) by deleting the following words –

"dog control officer" means a person designated as such in writing by the Permanent Secretary;

and replacing them by the words –

"dog controller" means a person, or organisation, designated as such by the Permanent Secretary;

(b) in the definition of "stray dog", by deleting the words "in a public place";

(c) by inserting in its appropriate alphabetical place, the following new definition –

"humane" means in such a manner as to inflict minimum pain and discomfort during and after intervention;

4. Section 4 of principal Act amended

Section 4 of the principal Act is amended –

(a) in subsection (2) –

(i) by deleting the words "7 days" and replacing them by the words "3 days";

(ii) by deleting the words "subsection (3)" and replacing them by the words "subsections (3), (4) and (5)";

- (b) in subsection (3)(b), by deleting the words “prescribed poundage fee” and replacing them by the words “reclamation fee specified in the Schedule”;
- (c) by inserting immediately after subsection (3), the following new subsections, the existing subsection (4) being renumbered (6) accordingly –
 - (4) No dog shall be returned to its owner unless it has been sterilised and tattooed.
 - (5) Any stray dog which is seized for the second time shall be returned to its owner –
 - (a) upon payment of the reclamation fee specified in the Schedule; and
 - (b) subject to such other conditions as may be specified by the officer in charge of the dog pound.

5. Section 5 of principal Act amended

Section 5 of the principal Act is amended –

- (a) by inserting immediately after subsection (2), the following new subsection, the existing subsections (3) and (4) being renumbered (4) and (5) accordingly -
 - (3) Where a stray dog has been caught for the third time, it shall be disposed of forthwith in a humane manner.
- (b) in the new subsection (5)(a), by deleting the words “prescribed poundage fee” and replacing them by the words “poundage fee specified in the Schedule”.

6. Section 6 of principal Act amended

Section 6 of the principal Act is amended in subsection (2), by deleting the word “who” and replacing it by the word “which”.

7. Section 7 of principal Act amended

Section 7 of the principal Act is amended by repealing subsection (2) and replacing it by the following subsection –

- (2) Any regulations made under subsection (1) may provide –
 - (a) for the amendment of the Schedule;
 - (b) for the levying of charges and the taking of fees.

8. Schedule added to principal Act

The principal Act is amended by adding the following new Schedule -

(section 4)**

Reclamation fee -	Rs
(a) for a registered dog	400
(b) for a registered dog which is not wearing a disc/collar	450
(c) for a registered dog which is wearing a disc/collar not belonging to it	500
(d) for a dog which is not registered	550
(e) for a registered dog caught for the second time	600
Poundage fee	600
