ENACTED by the Parliament of Mauritius, as follows -

1. Short title

This Act may be cited as the Supplementary Appropriation (2007-2008) (No.2) Act 2007.

2. Appropriation of excess expenditure for 2007-2008

A further total sum of three hundred and thirty-five million eight hundred and twenty two thousand and two hundred and thirty-eight rupees (Rs.335,822,238) consisting of the sums specified in the Schedule, which was duly paid and applied to the services of the Government during the financial year 2007-2008, is declared to have been validly paid out of the Consolidated Fund.
