THE FREEPORT ACT

Regulations made by the Minister, on the recommendation of the Economic Development Board, under sections 4(2) and 24(1)(b) of the Freeport Act

- 1. These regulations may be cited as the **Freeport (Amendment of Schedule) Regulations 2023.**
- 2. In these regulations —

"Act" means the Freeport Act.

3. The First Schedule to the Act is amended by adding Zone 33 as set out in the Schedule to these regulations.

SCHEDULE

[Regulation 3]

Zone 33, a plot of land of an extent of 26,884.00 rn² (bearing PIN 1217300284) subleased to

Trust Warehousing Ltd by GB WAREHOUSING LTD as per subleased agreement registered

L202304/000073 & L202306/000053, situated at Riche Terre in the district of Pamplemousses, forming part of a larger plot of 42.2 ha of State land leased to Silkroad International Investment Company Ltd as per lease transcribed in Volume TB201605/000090 and bounded as follows —

Towards the North by a road reserve seven metres sixty-three centimetres (7.63 m) wide lying along a projected common road seven metres and thirty centimetres (7.30 m) wide on eighty-six metres and thirty-eight centimetres (86.38 m);

Towards the East by the surplus of State land leased to Silkroad International Investment Company Ltd on two hundred and eighty-six metres and fifteen centimetres (286.15 m);

Towards the South by a road reserve ten metres (10.00 m) wide lying along a common road fourteen metres and sixty centimetres (14.60 m) wide, on ninety-two metres (92.00 m); and

Towards the West by a road reserve four metres and twenty centimetres (4.20 m) wide lying along a projected common road seven metres and thirty centimetres (7.30 m) wide, on three lines measuring, respectively, three metres and six centimetres (3.06 m), two hundred and seventy-six metres and thirty-nine centimetres (276.39 m) and ten metres and seventy-two centimetres (10.72 m).
