THE NATIONAL IDENTITY CARD ACT

Regulations made by the Minister under section 10 of the National Identity Card Act

- These regulations may be cited as the National Identity Card (Amendment No. 2) Regulations 2023.
- In these regulations —
 "principal regulations" means the National Identity Card Regulations 2013.
- **3.** Regulation 4 of the principal regulations is amended by deleting the words "10 years" and replacing them by the words "20 years".
- **4.** Regulation 7 of the principal regulations is revoked and replaced by the following regulation —

7. (1) Where the holder of a valid identity card attains the age of 60, he shall, within 90 days of attaining that age, make an application for a senior citizen identity card at such office as the Registrar may designate.

(2) Where a person is unable to comply with paragraph (1) on ground of serious illness, as certified by a medical practitioner, or any other compelling ground, he may make the application in such manner and within such period as the Registrar may determine.

(3) An applicant shall, upon being issued with a senior citizen identity card, surrender to the Registrar any identity card previously issued to him.

5. These regulations shall come into operation on 14 September 2023.
